## **Questions and Answers for Interested Assessors**

What is PLACE?	Patient Led Assessments of the Care Environment (PLACE) is an annual self-assessment of the patients' environment and non-clinical support services against common guidelines across the NHS. It is recognised that hospitals vary in age and design however this assessment helps NHS Trusts understand how well they are meeting the needs of their patients and identify where improvements can be made.		
What will the assessment Cover?	<ul> <li>All patient environmental and other related non-clinical support services including:</li> <li>How clean the environments are</li> <li>The condition of the building, fixtures and fittings (inside and outside)</li> <li>How well the building meets the needs of patients, i.e. car parks and signage</li> <li>The quality and availability of food and drinks</li> <li>How well the environment protects patients privacy and dignity</li> <li>How the environment meets the needs for patients with Dementia or with physical disabilities.</li> </ul>		
What does it mean to be an assessor?	The role of an assessor is an important one. We need people that can be objective and unbiased and do not allow themselves to be influenced. It involves making a clear commitment to quality and to viewing the hospital environment from a patients' perspective.		
Do I need any previous experience?	Clinical Representatives No, however it would be useful if you have been in post for at least 1 year  Patient Representatives No, however it would be useful if you have previously attended a hospital as a patient.		
What if I used to work at the Trust?	You cannot act as a patient assessor if you have left the organisation within the last 2 years		
What knowledge and skills do I need?	You will need the ability to understand simple guidance, have a common sense, unbiased and practical approach. You will need to be able to communicate clearly with patients and team members, listen actively, encourage people to talk, participate in discussions and contribute to a brief summary statement of what you see.		
Does it matter if I have a disability?	No, we would encourage anyone to participate. However, the assessment days can be long and very challenging. You need to be aware that the day can be extremely demanding – both mentally and physically.		
Is there any training?	Yes. All assessors will be required to complete a group training session prior to the assessment, regardless if they have undertaken an assessment previously. The training session will provide all assessors with an understanding of the PLACE programme, scoring methodology and how the assessments will be undertaken on the day.
